Mr. Secretary-General, the time has come to build the "The Civilization of the Third Millennium", with the tool of "Accomplished Democracy" which will undoubtedly emerge in Greece. To meet this challenge, the challenge of our generation, EVERYTHING IS AT HAND! Be the man that will take this leap of salvation toward freedom and dignity.

The plan "Map of the World Nations" put forward by Biosphere for Tomorrow (www.dakttari.org) is the antidote to wars and decline, and is relatively easy to implement. We must encourage heads of States to provide citizens with true information and to let people express their opinion.

Although the leaders of the western world will defend their actions, their defense policies too often lead to war. Nobody could doubt this any longer. The predominance of short term policies led by certain pressure groups has a direct impact on the future of the entire planet. International organizations suffer this pressure and are unable to independently generate policies which reduce conflicts.

Since 1989, Biosphere for Tomorrow proposes, through its plan Map of the World Nations, a credible alternative which will lead mankind to a future of Peace and Progress for all. It is high time to engage in these reforms. Humanity is facing a decisive stage in its evolution. It has never been so close and able to control its own destiny. And yet, mankind is unable to avoid the continuous deterioration in the economic situation of an ever increasing number of citizens in the world. The growing number of political convulsions and social fracture has even put in doubt the cohesion between the countries which take advantage of the great technologic advances of our age. Our civilizations seem to be fatally caught into a downward negative spiral. It is therefore essential to build a new society; or that, at least, the one we live in be deeply regenerated. The conclusions from analyzing the world affairs over the last twenty years can only reinforce the need to take this decision.

We must spread the idea, more and more widely among the people, that to build a society based on brotherhood is not a utopic dream. The tools exist to build this new society and to initiate this now vital process.

How? « Biosphere for Tomorrow's » proposals outline the overall framework of this initiative. It is possible to assist the birth of this new era, eagerly awaited since the beginning of time, by proposing three referendums, amongst which the most important is related to the Peace and the Future of Humanity.

It is necessary to accept a renewed vision of both peoples' security and defense, and this can only be achieved in collaboration with the best existing institutions. The proposed plan, "Map of the World Nations", would allow the establishment of a global, democratic and universal security system. Having this in mind, original solutions will strongly help to resolve conflicts and also avoid them. This is how the complete regenerating movement can be initiated. Of course, big efforts must be made to crown this will; the initial step is to drop old customs. After this it will be necessary to establish global fair trade, as an essential condition to the development and blossoming of people all around the world. This reform will be financed through the profit generated from progressively transforming excess military costs into investments which increase the general wellbeing of all populations. In addition, the adoption of the March conquest project by the community of the entire world countries would enable the conversion of high technologies currently used for negative purposes towards civil uses, with the promise of improving our day to day lives.

« On the whole, a nation's vital interests and its border security are guaranteed by a coalition of countries, who have all chosen the same united defense system, supported by each according to its possibilities, under the authority of the United Nations General-Secretary. In this manner, a nation which has chosen to entrust its military security could not, under any circumstance, be responsible for assaulting another

State, its own people, or be attacked without the immediate response of the international community. »

The general framework for this proposal includes the following:

* Signatory countries would commit to:

Immediately open a democratic dialogue between all members of society and arrange free elections.

Be respectful of all negotiated agreements concerning: Human Rights, education, disarmament, and environmental protection, amongst others.

Decrease military budgets to zero and transfer the corresponding funds over to the International Community. Representation within the UN will be guaranteed through an executive committee made up of representatives from the signatory countries.

Get all provisions of the Agreement approved by at least 2/3rd of the population. These mutual commitments could only be annulled in case of a negative vote of also $2/3^{rd}$ of the population.

* The International Community would, in return, commit to:

Legitimate the government of the undersigning country for a given period of time. The government would benefit from a relative majority in the elected assembly or assemblies.

Guarantee the country's integrity, in the event of internal or external attack using, if necessary, the armed forces under its control around the world.

Eradicate the private ownership of weapons.

Takeover control of the military budgets of the country, the International Community will manage these as it sees fit and reduce them 5% per year.

The Committee will decide how to engage those workers that previously depended upon this military budget, and assign jobs according to immediate needs or long terms purposes. This includes military action if decided so by the Committee or other public assignments such as construction, education, etc., that could take place in any country.

Each country will have one vote, no matter how big it is politically, economically and demographically.

The establishment of democracy could be coupled with the creation of a permanent consultative commission representing those authorities currently in power.

Consequences:

The standard of living of the poorest countries would quickly increase.

In order to boost credibility, acceptance of the agreement must be shared amongst a clear majority of the population.

Other powerful nations would refrain from intervening in any manner, thus cementing the choice taken and which will condition the future for years ahead, within the national conscience.

As counterpart, the commitments undersigned by the International Community should be respected at all costs.

Once a nation has chosen this security system, intervention in the case of civil unrest is automatic, no longer depending on fancies of whim or on the interests of this or that country.

The way our most developed democracies operate is not a good example to follow. To the point that many nations doubt that democracy is the best political system. The reforms we propose would give Democracy its strength back and establish it as a long term goal that would satisfy the most stringent expectations about the future held by most citizens.
